



Brunswick Sports Premium Funding 2021-2022

The sports premium funding is to be used to fund and make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE that we offer at Brunswick School.

The PE and sport premium award will be used to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
3. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Core Aims 2021-2022

The 5 key indicators drive our core aims:

- To continue to provide access to a wide and exciting range of sports and physical activities through high quality sports coaching for all pupils during the school day. This will ensure that staff continue to build confidence and access high quality training through involvement with expert practitioners.
- To continue to provide play leaders and expert coaches during lunchtimes and after school clubs. After school sports clubs led by expert coaches will be heavily subsidised and where possible will be fully funded for our most vulnerable pupils.
- To access local competitions and sports festivals through membership of local bodies.
- To maintain a safe play environment and high quality sports resources particular to the needs of our pupils.
- To continue to nurture talent and signpost pupils to local clubs, liaise with the feeder Junior School and provide alternative sporting opportunities adapting to the needs of the pupils.
- To enhance the PE curriculum by providing high quality physical activity through a tailor made "Forest Schools" programme for our KS1 throughout the year and EYFS in the Summer Term.

PE and Sport Premium Spend Breakdown

How will we do this?

Play/dance Leaders

Staff have led dance, cheer leading and football sessions during lunchtimes and during After School Club sessions. Some children in Year 2 have gone onto perform for families at the end celebrations.

Forest Schools

Every KS1 class will visit the forest each term. They will have at least 3 visits which will build skills and experiences over time. Forest Leaders will provide planning and learning activities that link to the curriculum. Physical games and play will be built in to these visits as well as links to other areas of learning such as Art, Science and Maths. The visits will happen over all 3 seasons so that the children experience the forest environment throughout the year and see the changes.

Gardening Club

The EYFS leader will run a gardening club which will involve physical activity, planting and maintaining the school growing garden. This will link to physical activity and stamina building and will be offered to Year 2 children at Key Stage 1.

Sports Equipment

Buy sports equipment as needed to use during sports sessions and during playtimes to encourage active play.

Eden Valley Sports Partnership Training and Coaching.

They will provide coaching across the year within school hours:

- **Autumn term**- Bikeability for all Year 1 pupils.

Entry into the Basic Moves Festival for our most vulnerable pupils. Two adults from school release time to attend and support the pupils in a district event.

- **Spring Term**- Dance Sessions for Key stage 1 building to a class performance.

Fund a free gymnastics after school club for Year 2 during the Spring Term. Fund entry into district and county competitions. Fund leotards and hoodies to wear and fund staff to attend the competitions and run the before and after school clubs.

- **Summer Term**- Multi-skills coaching for KS 1 pupils. Entry into the Multi-skills sports Festival for KS1 Pupils.

Fund transport for sporting events including the gymnastic competitions, multi-skills and Basic Moves.

Provide CPD opportunities through Eden Valley Sports Partnership when offered.

54° Sport Coaching

Continue to fund additional coaching through 54° Sport for KS1 classes throughout the year including a regular after school club. Including EYFS in the Summer Term.

Run a Sports Day afternoon for the whole of KS1 at St Catherine's field.

Support Jungle Fun Day active event in July.

Over lunchtime run a football/structured sports game for pupils to access on Fridays.

Cricket Coaching

Fund the high quality Cricket Coaching linked to Penrith Cricket Club "Chance to Shine"

Fund transport for trips to the forest, sporting events including the gymnastic competitions, multi-skills and Basic Moves.

Fund a Sports Coach /Play and Activity Leader to work for 2hrs each lunchtime and at our general after school club to provide sporting activities that can be accessed by all pupils. The coach will be able to provide advice and ideas to other colleagues that they are working with.

Impact 2021-2022

- The **EVSP** provided coaching throughout the year and all pupils made good progress. Visiting coaches commented positively on how we use the school grounds and hall and on the quality of the children's abilities.
 - We participated in the Basic Moves Festival in the Autumn Term and some of those pupils grew in confidence and then went on to attend some of our after school sports clubs for free. This is a way in which we support disadvantaged pupils and nurture talent.
 - We entered the Key Steps Gymnastics competition in the Spring Term and won the Penrith/Eden round. We then went on to compete at the County Final and were placed 4th overall.
 - During the Summer Term the Year 2 children went on to perform a Leavers Dance at the leavers assembly many of whom had benefitted from the Dance coaching in the Spring term. Some children also attended the Dance Club sessions led by an independent provider in the school hall.
 - At Brunswick we encourage the children to travel to school via bikes and scooters and there has been an increase in this since the Bikeability training.
 - Staff have benefited from being involved in P.E sessions led by professional coaches throughout the year.
- Every KS1 class has visited the forest at Birkmere throughout the year. Children have benefitted from the outdoor physical experience in many ways most notably they have developed the confidence to take risks and make mistakes. The forest teachers have commented positively in the changes in the pupils since the beginning of the year and their physical health has improved as a result of this engaging experience. The EYFS classes visited in the Summer Term and as a result have continued their experiences and learning through continued use of our very own Jungle Garden Area on the school grounds.
- At playtimes, lunchtimes and at After School Club the children have had access to play equipment and play leaders to engage in games and physical activity. A structured game is usually played on our football pitch area and this has engaged many of the pupils who may otherwise not have access to this at home.
- Every Friday Mr Armstrong from 54° Sports has run a variety of sports skills and games sessions throughout the year providing excellent CPD for school staff. The sports offered have ranged from archery, golf, cricket, football, fencing, tennis, hockey, and dodgeball to name but a few. There has also been a regular After School Sports Club which many of our pupils have attended. We have actively encouraged pupils with a particular talent or skill to attend the clubs after school and this has included disadvantaged pupils. Mr Armstrong and school staff have spotted talent and re-directed pupils to holiday clubs or local clubs in the town. Mr Armstrong has also secured funding for disadvantaged pupils over the school holidays and we have offered this to some of our disadvantaged pupils. Mr Armstrong has supported KS1 and worked with staff to run the summer sports day which was a huge success with the winning team scoring over 900 points! Again he was impressed with the talent and progress of pupils over the year to be able to compete in this competition. It included skills such as throwing the javelin and archery.

- Cricket coaching has again been a huge success this year. All pupils from nursery to Year 2 have participated and again pupils have been directed to the Chance to Shine cricket clubs within the town. Leaflets have been handed out to parents and some pupils have signed up. We have also offered a cricket club after school to all pupils and we have had a record number of Reception pupils engaging this year. Some disadvantaged pupils have again been targeted. The feedback from the cricket coach has been very positive. He was impressed with the level of skills and talent in our school (he works in many schools within the area). We will be signing up again for this coaching next year.

Future Plans 2022-2023

We will aim to offer the same high quality coaching to our pupils next year. We also aim to purchase a new P.E scheme of work to complement our high quality of coaching provision. Coaches have been booked for the next year for cricket and 54° Degrees Sport and we have once again signed up for the EVSP offer. PE, sports and physical activity will continue to be prioritised as it contributes importantly to the overall curriculum offered and the health and wellbeing of children.
