Word	Meaning
<b>Physical features</b>	Natural features of the earth's surface. Rivers, mountains and forests.
<b>Brazil</b>	This is the largest country in South America.
<b>Human features</b>	Features of the land built by humans. Roads, buildings and bridges.
<b>City</b>	A large town is a city. London is a city.
<b>continent</b>	A very large area of land that consists of many countries. Europe is a <b>continent</b> .
<b>Equator</b>	An imaginary line that the divides the earth into two equal parts. The area around the equator is very warm. The North pole and the South pole.
<b>Rio De Janeiro</b>	A city in Brazil.
<b>The Amazon</b>	A huge river that runs through the North of Brazil.
<b>Rainforest</b>	A forest habitat. They are found in warm places, and are full of many tall trees and leafy plants. It's called 'rainforest' because it also gets a lot of rain every year, helping all the plants grow.
Deforestation	The clearing or cutting down of forests by humans.
Country	An area of land separated by a border and controlled by its rulers.
Capital city	The city where the government (people in charge) are.
