Vocabulary	
<i>Word</i>	<i>Meaning</i>
Rite of Passage	Special ceremonies which mark an important stage in someone’s life. This is usually changing from one part of life to another.
Milestones	The biggest moments people celebrate on the journey of life.
Ceremony	A special event to mark an important occasion, such as a rite of passage.
Religious	To do with a belief in God or religion.
Secular	Things that are not to do with a belief in God or religion.
Symbol	Object, action or picture that expresses an idea or belief.
